Tonight, we journey through the passion of Jesus using four of our Stations of the Cross. Following communion, lights will dim, and as we listen to scripture and view the stations, you will be invited to sing choruses and share in responses, cued by a repeated line noted under each station. As the service ends, the sanctuary will be dark as the Christ Candle is removed and remains dark for a few moments. The lights will then be raised so you will be able to leave the sanctuary. Please **leave in silence**, as we wait through Good Friday and Holy Saturday for the breaking forth of Easter's dawn.






"It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him."
