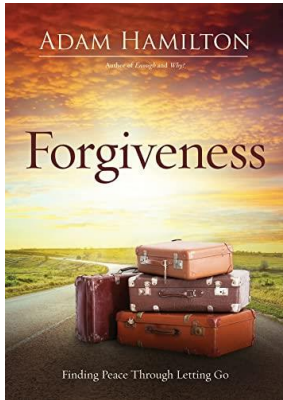
WESTMINSTER'S PRESCHOOL **REGISTRATION FOR 2022-2023**
