Some people have deviated from these and turned to meaningless talk, desiring to be teachers of the law, without understanding either what they are saying or the things about which they make assertions.

Now we know that the law is good, if one uses it legitimately. This means understanding that the law is laid down not for the innocent but for the lawless and disobedient, for the godless and sinful, for the unholy and profane, for those who kill their father or mother, for murderers, fornicators, sodomites, slave-traders, liars, perjurers, and whatever else is contrary to the sound teaching that conforms to the glorious gospel of the blessed God, which he entrusted to me.

I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.

## CLERK'S CORNER

During its September 20 meeting, the Session:

- Approved the call of a Congregation Meeting for Sunday, October 23 – the meeting likely being both a rolling variety at the start of each service, with an on-line Zoom component for the purpose of electing officers to assume roles in January, 2023;
- Approved a child for baptism.
- After reviewing his application and engaging in conversation, endorsed Chris Clark becoming an Inquirer (first step in becoming a pastor) and naming Diane DeSieno-Lane as his Liaison with Donegal Presbytery.
- Had a conversation over Zoom with Donegal Stated Clerk Rev. Dr. Michael Wilson about healthy boundaries in pastoral transitions.
- Elected Sandra Kurek as Treasurer for the balance of 2022.
- Approved \$7,432 from the Memorial Fund to develop a 2<sup>nd</sup> Zoom Room – this one in the Site.
- Learned the Trustees approved \$112,000 from Property Reserve to replace a Chiller for our HVAC system.
- Approved 3 Motions from Outreach 1) approve hosting a 30 min. Narcan training session on Sunday, October 9, 2) use up to \$10,000 from the Mission Trip Fund to help defray cost of staff and members attending Honduras Mission festival in Florida; and 3) approve use of Westminster's portion of Peace & Global Witness Offering for Rise Against Hunger.
- Approved Personnel's Motion to endorse Pastor Jon Frost's plan for a Sabbatical in the summer of 2023.
- Heard plans from both Children's and Adults' Spiritual Growth teams about the growth of in-person opportunities for learning and study.
- Requested the Property Committee to develop a churchwide emergency evacuation plan.
- Reviewed the plans for the fall stewardship campaign and were encouraged as leaders to increase our commitment and pledge early in the process.
- Read the various ways the Youth and College Ministries team is engaging with the youth and young adults in our congregation.

- Reviewed Deacons support of fellowship at Westminster summer and into fall.
- Received a good enrollment report from Preschool.
- Updates on various initiatives by the Home Team.
