SCRIPTURE LESSON 1 Corinthians 12:12-27 (pew Bible pg. 933)

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot were to say, ‘Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body’, that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear were to say, ‘Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body’, that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, ‘I have no need of you’, nor again the head to the feet, ‘I have no need of you.’ On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and those members of the body that we think less honourable we clothe with greater honour, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honour to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honoured, all rejoice together with it.

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

HELP US CELEBRATE REV. JENNIE CLARK'S RETIREMENT

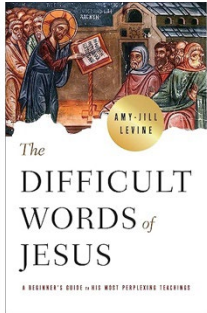

2024 JOURNEY CLASS LENTEN STUDY

“Difficult Words of Jesus: A Beginner’s Guide to His Most Perplexing Teachings”

6-week DVD study by Amy-Jill Levine February 18, 25, March 3, 10, 17, 24



Jesus provided his disciples teachings for how to follow Torah, God’s word. He told them parables to help them discern questions of ethics and of human nature. He offered them beatitudes for comfort and encouragement. But sometimes Jesus spoke words that followers then and now have found troubling.

In *The Difficult Words of Jesus*, Amy-Jill shows how these challenging teachings would have sounded to the people who first heard them, how they have been understood over time, and how we might interpret them in the context of the gospel of love and reconciliation. In this study, Amy-Jill invites us to look at sayings that puzzle not only beginners, but even seasoned students of Scripture. She brings these challenging texts alive for us and invites us in as active participants in the gospel story. Message from Gerry McShane, Church Administrator- We ended the year with strong giving, 12% above last December, and enough to give us a small surplus for the year. Remember where we were at this time last year, projecting a budget that would force us to withdraw \$183k from our operating reserves. The results are impressive when one considers our pledge drives have declined every year since 2020. Historically, we have averaged a 3% allowance for uncollected pledges but in the past two years we are less than 1%. While our unfulfilled pledges were 5% of total pledged dollars this past year, we have donors who fulfill and then exceed their pledge, thus bringing the percentage of pledged dollars received this year to 99.6%. In fact, our average pledged dollar has increased 35% in the past two years. This is meaningful. In summary, while our individual pledgors are down, we have a significant number of dedicated and engaged members who are joyfully giving.

Controlling expenses was also a large contributing factor to this year's small surplus, as personnel costs were down 6% vs. plan. The strong December allowed us to contribute an additional \$25k to our Property Reserve fund, an important decision based on our heavy property investments from this past year led by the new chiller, and projected investments for '24, (i.e., Spellman roof, new doors, and windows for Sanctuary wing). We enter the 2024 calendar year with a new Associate Music Director and a 2nd FT custodian, the latter to handle the increase in church ministry engagement and outside group usage. Thank you to everyone who is contributing their time, their talent and ultimately their treasure!
