STEWARDSHIP JOURNEY

As a Presbyterian Earth Care Congregation, Westminster Presbyterian Church has made meaningful strides in caring for God's creation over the past five years. Central to our efforts has been our Care for Creation committee, which led a variety of initiatives to reduce our environmental footprint and engage our congregation in sustainable practices.



Early Steps Gleaning Garden, Earth Sunday & Education

Our journey included the creation and recent expansion of a gleaning garden that donates fresh produce to our local Food Cupboard fore more than five years. Since then we have engaged our congregation with successful Earth Sunday events, introducing the congregation to the principles of Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and Refuse. This sparked a series of projects, including a Lenten Challenge to reduce plastic water bottle use, printing our own reusable grocery and produce bags, and supporting local creek clean up events.

Reducing Waste & romoting Sustainability

To minimize waste, we replaced disposable paper cups with real mugs, thanks to donations from the congregation. We installed a compost bin for church food waste, manage the collection of batteries for recycling and promote the recycling of oral hygiene products for congregation members and the local community. Additionally, our Shop for Hope Alternative Christmas Markets promoted sustainable gifts like bamboo utensil sets, laundry detergent sheets, composting etc. which not only raised awareness but also sparked eco-friendly habits in the community.





Educating &

Our most recent Earth Sunday included speakers from environmental organizations to deepen our understanding of creation care. In addition, our biweekly Nerve to Serve newsletter continues to share practical tips on sustainable living, keeping the congregation informed and inspired. In worship we have shared our Earth Pledge and ideas for good stewardship of creation in both sermons and our Minute for

Solar Power Initiative

One of our largest projects has been exploring solar power for our church building. Though still in the works, we invited experts and connected with local officials to explore our options for a more sustainable energy future.

This April, our Earth Sunday focus will be "Restyle," encouraging more responsible buying and reusing of clothing, including a sneaker recycling drive. This initiative underscores our ongoing commitment to mindful consumption and reducing waste.

Sustainable Facilities

Our church building has made significant strides in sustainability, including the installation of LED lighting to reduce energy consumption, replacing our windows and doors with more energy efficient ones, reducing printed materials around the building and more planned in 2025. These efforts reflect our commitment to environmental stewardship in all aspects of church life.
