

SCRIPTURE LESSON

Luke 1:5-17


(Pew Bible pg. 830)

In the days of King Herod of Judea, there was a priest named Zechariah, who belonged to the priestly order of Abijah. His wife was a descendant of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. Both of them were righteous before God, living blamelessly according to all the commandments and regulations of the Lord. But they had no children, because Elizabeth was barren, and both were getting on in years.

Once when he was serving as priest before God and his section was on duty, he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to enter the sanctuary of the Lord and offer incense. Now at the time of the incense-offering, the whole assembly of the people was praying outside. Then there appeared to him an angel of the Lord, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. When Zechariah saw him, he was terrified; and fear overwhelmed him.

But the angel said to him, 'Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you will name him John.

You will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He must never drink wine or strong drink; even before his birth he will be filled with the Holy Spirit. He will turn many of the people of Israel to the Lord their God. With the spirit and power of Elijah he will go before him, to turn the hearts of parents to their children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous, to make ready a people prepared for the Lord.'



SECOND SCRIPTURE LESSON Luke 1: 57-66 (Pew Bible pg. 832) Now the time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and she bore a son. Her neighbours and relatives heard that the Lord had shown his great mercy to her, and they rejoiced with her.

On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him Zechariah after his father. But his mother said, 'No; he is to be called John.' They said to her, 'None of your relatives has this name.' Then they began motioning to his father to find out what name he wanted to give him. He asked for a writing-tablet and wrote, 'His name is John.' And all of them were amazed. Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue freed, and he began to speak, praising God. Fear came over all their neighbours, and all these things were talked about throughout the entire hill country of Judea. All who heard them pondered them and said, 'What then will this child become?' For, indeed, the hand of the Lord was with him.

Thrift Shop News - The Westminster Thrift Shop Board of Directors, at their recent November board meeting, unanimously passed a motion to donate \$10,000 to the Thrift Shop Mission Fund, the recipients being: West Chester Senior Center, ACT now (formerly Act in Faith) and the Chester County Housing Authority Fuel Assistance. We have been able to donate the following monies, just over the past three years: \$16,000 in 2023; \$35,000 in 2024 (recognizing the thrift shop's 35 years in business); and \$10,000 in 2025, with a total of 14 organizations being recipients. The Westminster Thrift Shop's mission statement is: to promote quality recycled merchandise at affordable prices to local families; to care for creation by providing an outlet for recycled goods. With God's blessings in 2026, the Westminster Thrift Shop will continue to provide much needed funding for organizations in need, surpassing our present grand total of \$394,000. Pledged giving rebounded nicely in October and was helped by the large gift received early in the month. The hope is that November and December end strong, similar to last year when we received \$390k, and narrows the projected deficit. Facility revenue has been strong the past two months and is close to budget, one outlier to the grouping (Per Capita, Investment Income, Special Offerings, Cash in Plate, etc.) that has underperformed this year.

Expenses would otherwise be over budget were it not for Personnel which has come in under budget every year since the first year I started in 2013. The main contributor is the budgeting of a Spiritual Care Director to begin in September, but this position has not yet been filled. Property remains well above plan due to Security, Landscaping, Snow Removal, Energy, and the Repairs & Maintenance budget lines.
