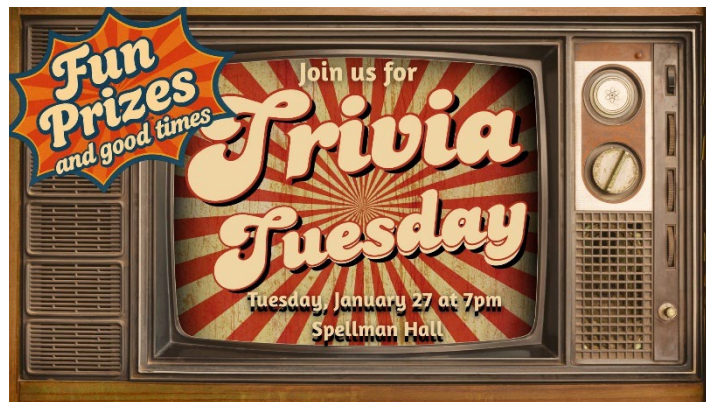

Both Pledged and Non-Pledged giving exceeded budget in November. However, outstanding pledges at month-end are below the total needed to make the December budget despite member contributions beyond their pledged amounts. December is generally a strong giving month as remaining pledges are fulfilled. While other revenue exceeds budget and investment income is expected to be close to year-end budget, other income categories continue to underperform this year (Per Capita, Special Offerings, Cash in Plate, etc.).
