SCRIPTURE LESSON

John 4:1-30

(Pew Page 864-865)

Now when Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard, 'Jesus is making and baptizing more disciples than John'— although it was not Jesus himself but his disciples who baptized— he left Judea and started back to Galilee. But he had to go through Samaria. So he came to a Samaritan city called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired out by his journey, was sitting by the well. It was about noon.

A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, 'Give me a drink'. (His disciples had gone to the city to buy food.) The Samaritan woman said to him, 'How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria?' (Jews do not share things in common with Samaritans.) Jesus answered her, 'If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, "Give me a drink", you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water.' The woman said to him, 'Sir, you have no bucket, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? Are you greater than our ancestor Jacob, who gave us the well, and with his sons and his flocks drank from it?' Jesus said to her, 'Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again,

but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.'

The woman said to him, 'Sir, give me this water, so that I may never be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water.' Jesus said to her, 'Go, call your husband, and come back.' The woman answered him, 'I have no husband.' Jesus said to her, 'You are right in saying, "I have no husband"; for you have had five husbands, and the one you have now is not your husband. What you have said is true!'

The woman said to him, 'Sir, I see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshipped on this mountain, but you say that the place where people must worship is in Jerusalem.' Jesus said to her, 'Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father seeks such as these to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.' The woman said to him, 'I know that Messiah is coming' (who is called Christ). 'When he comes, he will proclaim all things to us.' Jesus said to her, 'I am he, the one who is speaking to you.'

Just then his disciples came. They were astonished that he was speaking with a woman, but no one said, 'What do you want?' or, 'Why are you speaking with her?' Then the woman left her water-jar and went back to the city. She said to the people, 'Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?' They left the city and were on their way to him.

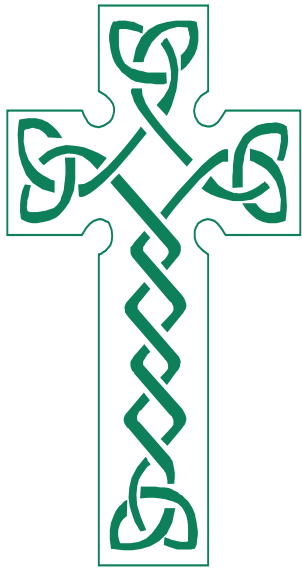

CLERK'S CORNER

During its January 20th meeting, the Session:

- Joined with Deacons for the annual joint dinner and meeting and heard rich statements of faith from three incoming elders and two incoming deacons, sustained the examinations for elders and deacons and planned their ordination/installation for Sunday, January 25th (now rescheduled to February 8th) - this is annually one of the holiest, most sacred experiences for deacons and elders;
- Offered Thanks and Appreciation to outgoing officers – Elders Anne Jaques, Jim Magee and Lynae Young; Deacons Judy Bianchi, Judy Eberhardt, Joanne Ebert, Karen Finley, Jean Pitts and Paul Zamrowski, and Trustees Scott Boorse and Steve Brown;
- Authorized the Outreach Committee to conduct its annual collections for various causes including: underwear, hygiene kits, toiletries, soup making, diapers, backpacks, socks, coats, turkeys, Giving Tree, prepared meals, household items, scarves, gloves & mittens, food and furniture, etc.;
- Approved Westminster's publicizing information and requests for financial support from the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) in response to National and International disasters;
- Approved adding Nancy Steiginga to Outreach Committee and Rachel Pitts as CSG youth committee member for 2026;
- Approved recommended Motions from Trustees to meet 2025 deficit of \$102,355 with funds from Operating Reserve, spending \$3,030 for removal of damaged tree and disbursement from Memorial Fund for new convection ovens in kitchen;
- Cheered the announcement the new digital sign is now fully operational;
- Approved 3 Motions from Personnel: 1) to hire new Director of Spiritual Care who will start March 1st – introduction to come after the candidate's current employer is informed; 2) a job description for a part-time Acting Director of Youth Ministries; and 3) revised job title and description of roles and responsibilities for Associate Pastor Jon Frost;
- Approved Motion from ASG to offer opportunities to watch and discuss 2 talks in Calvin University's January series;
- Approved Motion from CSG to collect financial contributions to cover needed supplies for this year's Camp Spark service projects;
- Approved Motion from Youth & College Ministries to send \$900 to the Baptist Church of West Chester to help fund Donuts and Discussion ministry for spring 2026;
- Heard from Worship & Arts of planning for the Elevation Workshop and Concert in February;

- Heard Home Team's plans for Kathryn Evans of Church Housing Corp (CHC) to kick off the congregation's discernment process about possibly using some of Westminster's land for an attainable housing community;
- Reviewed and discussed the Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP) prepared by the APNC searching for our next installed pastor for Spiritual Growth, with recent review from Donegal's Executive Presbyter Rev. Dr. Erin Cox-Holmes and voted if the way be clear to submit it to Donegal's Connecting Our Ministry team this week;
- Shared congregational cares, concerns and joys, and lifted all these in prayer at the end of the meeting.

We ended 2025 with a budget deficit of \$102,355. Identified giving totaled \$2,129,104 representing a 2.9% increase over 2024, but falling \$80,896 short of budget, which had assumed a 6.8% increase. In addition to the shortfall in giving, we experienced significant overages in property expenses, along with increased security costs related to a consistent police presence on Sundays in accordance with our safety plan. Entering 2025, Westminster held an operating reserve of \$257,306. The 2025 deficit will reduce that reserve to \$154,951.
