Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged. And the soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they dressed him in a purple robe. They kept coming up to him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" and striking him on the face. Pilate went out again and said to them, "Look, I am bringing him out to you to let you know that I find no case against him." So Jesus came out wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate^[a] said to them, "Behold the man!" When the chief priests and the police saw him, they shouted, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and crucify him; I find no case against him." The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die because he has claimed to be the Son of God."

Now when Pilate heard this, he was more afraid than ever. He entered his headquarters again and asked Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. Pilate therefore said to him, "Do you refuse to speak to me? Do you not know that I have power to release you and power to crucify you?" Jesus answered him, "You would have no power over me unless it had been given you from above; therefore the one who handed me over to you is guilty of a greater sin." From then on Pilate tried to release him, but the Jews cried out, "If you release this man, you are no friend of Caesar. Everyone who claims to be a king sets himself against Caesar."

When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus outside and sat on the judge's bench at a place called The Stone Pavement, or in Hebrew Gabbatha. Now it was the day of Preparation for the Passover, and it was about noon. He said to the Jews, "Here is your King!" They cried out, "Away with him! Away with him! Crucify him!" Pilate asked them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar." Then he handed him over to them to be crucified.

CARING FOR OUR SANCTUARY – We ask that you refrain from bringing food and drink into our Sanctuary to protect our carpet.

A REMOTE TV MONITOR is in the Quiet Room (just outside the sanctuary in the west hallway) to view and hear worship in progress for those with restless children or who need to leave the sanctuary.

HEARING ASSISTANCE DEVICES are available for worship at the Information Center in the Narthex. Additionally, the sanctuary is equipped with an induction loop system that transmits to hearing aids and cochlear implants with telecoils. **PEW CUSHIONS** also available at the Information Center.

PRAY GROUNDS ARE LOCATED along the sides of our Sanctuary and are geared towards young children to engage in items from the cart during worship. This allows a space more suitable for them to be a part of the worship service.

We renew our baptismal life as we see again the battle that God in Christ wins against all the powers of darkness and destruction in our world and in our lives.

A meaningful way of praying during Holy Week is simply to follow the labyrinth. All we must do in our prayer is to be open and receptive, content to follow and to receive what God chooses to give us. He allows himself to be taken on a journey by the Father. So let scripture and reflections take you on this road. Be attentive to it. Notice its details. Entrust yourself to it.

SECOND ANNUAL SNEAKER RECYCLING DRIVE KICKS OFF MARCH 20

From March 20 through April 17, Westminster will host our Second Annual Sneaker Recycling Drive in partnership with Sneaker Impact as part of the church's celebration of Earth Day. The drive offers a simple but powerful way for our community to reduce waste and care for the environment.

Each year in the United States, more than 300 million pairs of shoes are thrown away, and nearly 95% end up in landfills. Sneakers can take decades to break down, contributing to growing waste and environmental strain. By collecting used sneakers and sending them for reuse or responsible recycling, our community can help keep these materials out of landfills and give them a second life.

We welcome all sneakers—whether gently used or completely worn out. Pairs in good condition may be reused, while others will be responsibly recycled through Sneaker Impact's programs.

Last year, Westminster's community collected more than 750 pairs of sneakers, an incredible response for our first drive. This year, we're hoping to go even further—and we invite everyone to participate.

Be sure to join us on Sunday, April 19 for Earth Sunday, when we'll announce the total number of sneakers collected and award prizes to those who guessed closest to the final count.

This initiative reflects Westminster's commitment as a PCUSA-certified Earth Care Congregation and offers a meaningful way to practice faithful stewardship and care for God's creation—one pair of sneakers at a time.

Net Surplus (Deficit)	\$398,516	\$317,979	25.3%

Revenue is currently \$42k (5.8%) above budget, and expenses are \$38k (9.5%) below budget, resulting in a net surplus of \$80k (25.3%) stronger than planned. This positive outlook is partly due to timing differences. Delayed February budgeted Outreach and Audit Review payments and February Snow Removal expense billed in March understate expense. We are also seeing a strong and encouraging response to Per Capita giving, which has contributed positively to the early-year results.
