SCRIPTURE LESSON

Acts 2 :1-21

(Pew Page 884)

Our Second Scripture Lesson comes from Acts 2:1-21. Please join on the parts in bold. Let us listen to God's Word together.

Voice 1: When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

Voice 2: Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. Utterly amazed, they asked:

**East Side: Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans?
Then how is it that each of us hears them in his own
native language?**

**West Side: We hear them declaring the wonders of God in our
own tongues!**

Voice 2: Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another,

East Side: What does this mean?

Voice 1: Some, however, made fun of them and said,

West Side: "They have had too much wine."

Voice 2: Then Peter stood up with the eleven, raised his voice, and addressed the crowd: Fellow Jews and all of you who are in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. These men are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! No, this is what was spoken by God through the prophet Joel:

Voice 1: In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy. I will show wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke. The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord. And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

A REMOTE TV MONITOR is in the Quiet Room (just outside the sanctuary in the west hallway) to view and hear worship in progress for those with restless children or who need to leave the sanctuary.

HEARING ASSISTANCE DEVICES are available for worship at the Information Center in the Narthex. Additionally, the sanctuary is equipped with an induction loop system that transmits to hearing aids and cochlear implants with telecoils.

PRAY GROUNDS ARE LOCATED along the sides of our Sanctuary and are geared towards young children to engage in items from the cart during worship. This allows a space more suitable for them to be a part of the worship service.

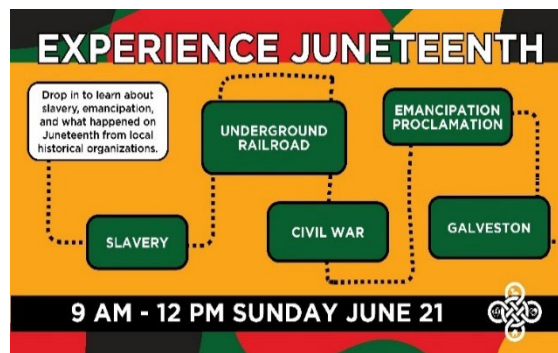

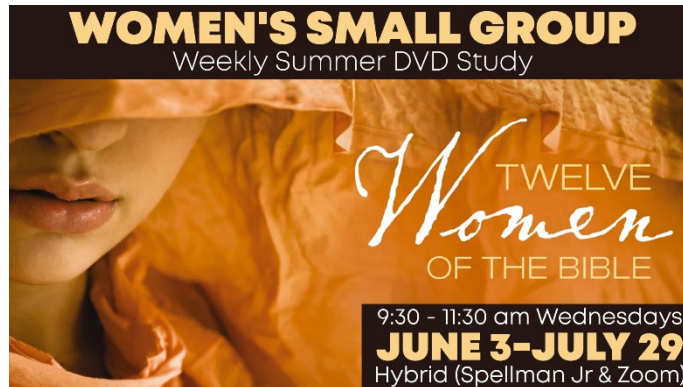

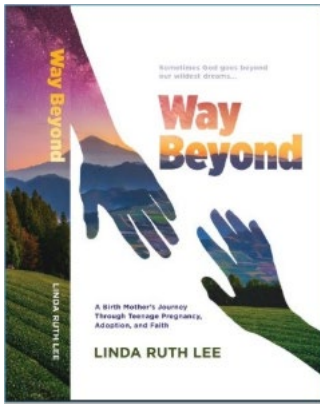


WOMEN'S SUMMER BIBLE STUDY

Director of Engagement

This position provides strategic leadership for how Westminster connects with people across the full lifecycle of engagement—guest, participant, member, and leader. This role ensures that communications, digital platforms including church management systems, and engagement initiatives are aligned with the church's mission, vision, and strategic priorities. Year-to-date revenue remains strong running 8.6% above budget, with giving exceeding expectations for the second consecutive month and first-quarter giving reaching 40.1% of the annual budget. This follows our historic pattern of giving with some members using QCDs or CGA to fulfill pledges early in the year. Expenses are slightly under budget overall despite some timing-related overages in March.

Additional revenue streams and program participation (especially youth retreats) are exceeding expectations. As a result, the church has generated a net surplus 27.5% ahead of budget, while continuing to monitor seasonal giving patterns.
